



Articles of Association  
of  
The Outer Banks Anglers Club

Article I

NAME AND ORGANIZATION

The name of this association is The Outer Banks Anglers Club, hereinafter referred to as the "Club". The Club is designated an unincorporated nonprofit association created under the laws of the State of North Carolina.

Article II

INTENT AND PURPOSE

- A. The intent and primary purpose of the Club is:
1. The entertainment and education of its members
  2. The promotion of safety, good fellowship and true sportsmanship among all anglers
- B. The Club shall also be concerned with:
1. The advancement of these resources as a source of pleasure to those who engage in recreational angling
  2. The promotion of legislation, customs and practices for the protection, propagation and conservation of fish and other marine creatures and their habitats
- C. The Club may engage in any and all other charitable activities permitted an organization exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c) (7) of the Code or corresponding future provisions of the federal tax law.
- D. To these ends, the Club may do and engage in any and all lawful activities that may be incidental or reasonably necessary to any of these purposes, and it shall have and may exercise all other powers and authority now or here after conferred upon unincorporated nonprofit associations in the State of North Carolina.

Article III

OFFICE AND DURATION

- A. The office of the Club shall be located at the address at which the President has official residence; or at such place as the Club may from time to time determine, or as the business of the Club may require.
- B. The duration of the Club shall be perpetual.
- C. The death, removal or resignation of any member of the Club shall not result in the dissolution of the Club.

Article IV

STRUCTURE AND MEMBERSHIP

- A. The membership of the Club consists of individuals interested in the intent, purpose, and concern of the Club listed in Article III
- B. Membership in the Club becomes effective upon the payment of annual dues in an amount set by a quorum of then existing member of the organization.
- C. The Club does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, sex, age, religious affiliation, handicap, national origin, or other personal factor.



#### Article V

##### ASSOCIATION LEADERSHIP

- A. The Club shall be governed by at least five officers to be determined by the membership. The name and total number of officer positions will be determined as the membership requires, changeable as circumstances necessitate.
- B. One member will be designated as the Club's agent in this state as needed, following state law requirements.
- C. Thirty members of the then-existing membership constitute a quorum of the Club. Officers may be elected by nomination and a majority vote of at least a quorum of the Club.

#### Article VI

##### ACCOUNTING AND RECORDS

- A. The fiscal year of the Club shall be January 1 through December 31 of each year.
- B. All minute books, correspondence, and other records of the Club shall be preserved by the officers. Records that have ceased to be of use for the conduct of the affairs of the Club may be turned over for preservation to a depository designated by it, or discarded.

#### Article VII

##### DISSOLUTION

In the event of the dissolution of the Club, its property, funds, and other assets shall be transferred to whatever organization or organizations operated exclusively for charitable, educational, and/or scientific purposes as the Club may determine, provided such organization or organizations qualify as tax-exempt under the Internal Revenue Code of the United States.
